<b>1. Summary</b>
<p>When the Board previously discussed the Bus Policy Manual, Members asked for a short paper on our policy priorities and tactics. <p>The focus of the Roadmap is on how we develop and promote our policy priorities. It is not the intention to duplicate the Corporate Plan or the Work Plan, although where appropriate it does borrow from them. Neither do we attempt to set out our full research programme.</p> <p>While it is acknowledged that the coming year will be untypical, the Roadmap covers a 3-5 year time horizon. The top level ways in which we go about developing and promoting our policies are unlikely to change significantly over this period, although there may be some shifts in emphasis.</p> <p>We still have further work to do to understand the concerns and priorities of bus passengers. However, the companion report on <i>Bus policy and research ideas</i> is designed to stimulate debate.</p>
