




#### Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 47 The proportion of people using public transport is consistent with recent weeks




Changed from 'last 7 days' to 'last two weeks' between week 34 (8-10 Jan) and week 40 (1-5 April)


### Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 47 The proportion who have used a bus or a train has been largely consistent over recent weeks



#### Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 47 Road use is consistent




### Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 47 More than two in five have made journeys on foot, while fewer have cycled


#### **Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 47**

Journeys made for leisure reasons and journeys made to or from a place of work have continued to increase




#### **Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 47**

Less than one in five have been avoiding public transport, or haven't used public transport because they don't feel safe to do so




## Around two in five users of trains and a similar proportion of bus users found it to be busier than they expected

On the last occasion that you made a journey by train, was it..? Base: All making journeys by train – 142




On the last occasion that you made a journey by bus, was it..? Base: All making journeys by bus – 260

Specifically in relation to coronavirus, how safe do you feel at the moment when using trains?








#### Half of those who have not used a bus in the last seven days say they would feel safe doing so

### For three in five Coronavirus is a major concern. Those who have a disability are more likely than others to agree.





## Half think that enough is being done to ensure coronavirus safety on public transport. One in five disagree.






## Three in ten say that they will never again feel completely comfortable on public transport


### Around three quarters have been avoiding unnecessary activities due to the coronavirus


### More than half say that they won't use public transport unless social distancing is in place




# More than two in five say that as long as passengers are wearing face coverings, relaxing the social distancing on public transport makes sense to them


# More than half of those who used a bus in the last seven days are aware of the changes to the rules regarding the use of buses in England and what this might mean to them

I am aware that on buses in England all forward facing seats are now available to use, so passengers may need to sit next to people outside their 'bubble'


#### **Transport Focus Data Hub**

#### Please note:

Data from new waves of the survey is uploaded and made available on each Friday morning. The survey may be unavailable on the hub on Thursday afternoon while the upload of new data takes place.



#### Survey method and sample breakdown – week 47

- c.2000 online interviews per wave. Using Yonder Consulting omnibus.
- Nationally representative of Great British population not all respondents are passengers on public transport.
- Those who have provided a response are excluded from the subsequent wave of research.
- Fieldwork repeated every weekend. Wave 47 fieldwork: 21 23 May
- The analysis of attitudinal questions excludes responses from those who don't have an opinion or who say that the question is not applicable to them.
