


### Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 53 Use of public transport has fallen slightly




Changed from 'last 7 days' to 'last two weeks' between week 34 (8-10 Jan) and week 40 (1-5 April)




### Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 53 The proportion who have used a train outside London or a London Bus has fallen slightly



### Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 53 Road use is largely consistent




## Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 53 More than two in five have made journeys on foot, while fewer have cycled


### **Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 53**

Less than one in five haven't used public transport because they don't feel safe to do so, or because they have been avoiding doing so



## More than half of those who have used a train in the last seven days found it to be busier than they expected


On the last occasion that you made a journey by train, was it..? Base: All making journeys by train. W53 - 141

On the last occasion that you made a journey by bus, was it..? Base: All making journeys by bus. W53 - 318




# Around nine in ten of those making train journeys in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so


# Almost nine in ten of those making bus journeys in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so




### Less than three in five of those who have not used a train in the last seven days say that they would feel safe doing so




### Half of those who have not used a bus in the last seven days say they would feel safe doing so



## For more than half Coronavirus is a major concern. Those who have a disability are more likely than others to agree.



## Less than half think that enough is being done to ensure coronavirus safety on public transport. A quarter disagree.









# Slowly decreasing proportions say that they won't use public transport unless social distancing is in place




### **Transport Focus Data Hub**

### Survey method and sample breakdown – week 53

- c.2000 online interviews per wave. Using Yonder Consulting omnibus.
- Nationally representative of Great British population not all respondents are passengers on public transport.
- Those who have provided a response are excluded from the subsequent wave of research.
- Fieldwork repeated every weekend. Wave 53 fieldwork: 2 4 July
- The analysis of attitudinal questions excludes responses from those who don't have an opinion or who say that the question is not applicable to them.
