




Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 55 Use of public transport has increased




Changed from 'last 7 days' to 'last two weeks' between week 34 (8-10 Jan) and week 40 (1-5 April)


Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 55 Greater proportions have used trains and buses



Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 55 Road use is largely consistent




Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 55 More than two in five have made journeys on foot, while fewer have cycled


Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 55

One in five haven't used public transport because they don't feel safe to do so, while falling proportions have been avoiding doing so






Two in five of those who have used a train in the last seven days found it to be busier than they expected

Less than half of those who have used a London bus in the last seven days found it to be busier than they expected




Around nine in ten of those making train journeys in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so




Almost nine in ten of those making journeys by bus outside London in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so








Less than three in five of those who have not used a train in the last seven days say that they would feel safe doing so




Half of those who have not used a bus in the last seven days say they would feel safe doing so



For almost three in five Coronavirus is a major concern. Those who have a disability are more likely than others to agree.



Increasing proportions do not feel that enough is being done to ensure coronavirus safety on public transport




A third say that they will never again feel completely comfortable on public transport





A half say that they won't use public transport unless social distancing is in place




Transport Focus Data Hub

Survey method and sample breakdown – week 55

- c.2000 online interviews per wave. Using Yonder Consulting omnibus.
- Nationally representative of Great British population not all respondents are passengers on public transport.
- Those who have provided a response are excluded from the subsequent wave of research.
- Fieldwork repeated every weekend. Wave 55 fieldwork: 16 18 July
- The analysis of attitudinal questions excludes responses from those who don't have an opinion or who say that the question is not applicable to them.
