






Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 57 Use of public transport is fairly stable




Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 57 Increasing proportions have been using buses outside London since the start of May this year




Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 57 Road use is largely consistent




Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 57 Two in five have made journeys on foot



Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 57 Increasing proportions have been making journeys for leisure reasons such as eating out or visiting attractions




Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 57 One in five haven't used public transport because they don't feel safe to do so, while fewer have had no reason to use public transport


A third of those who have used a bus outside London in the last seven days found it to be busier than they expected




Around nine in ten of those making train journeys in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so

Specifically in relation to coronavirus, how safe do you feel at the moment when using trains? Base: All making journeys by train, W57 – 193




Almost nine in ten of those making journeys by bus outside London in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so

Specifically in relation to coronavirus, how safe do you feel at the moment when using buses? Base: All making journeys by bus outside London, W57 – 239




Four in five of those making journeys by bus in London in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so







Over one in four do not feel that enough is being done to ensure coronavirus safety on public transport




What types of things would you most like to see being done to ensure coronavirus safety on public transport? (top 10 responses)




Almost a third say that they will never again feel completely comfortable on public transport



Survey method and sample breakdown – week 57

- c.2000 online interviews per wave. Using Yonder Consulting omnibus.
- Nationally representative of Great British population not all respondents are passengers on public transport.
- Those who have provided a response are excluded from the subsequent wave of research.
- Fieldwork repeated every weekend. Wave 57 fieldwork: 30 July 1 August
- The analysis of attitudinal questions excludes responses from those who don't have an opinion or who say that the question is not applicable to them.
