




Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 58 Use of public transport has increased




Changed from 'last 7 days' to 'last two weeks' between week 34 (8-10 Jan) and week 40 (1-5 April)

Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 58 Use of trains, both in and outside London have increased recently




Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 58 Road use is largely consistent



Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 58 Two in five have made journeys on foot, while


fewer have cycled


Increasing proportions have been making journeys for leisure reasons such as eating out or visiting attractions, or for visiting friends or relatives


Around nine in ten of those making train journeys in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so




Almost nine in ten of those making journeys by bus outside London in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so




Four in five of those making journeys by bus in London in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so





Decreasing proportions of those who used a train or a bus in the last seven days wore a face covering for the whole of their journey




More than half of those who have not used a bus in the last seven days say they would feel safe doing so



For half Coronavirus is a major concern. Those who have a disability are more likely than others to agree



Three in ten do not feel that enough is being done to ensure coronavirus safety on public transport



A third say that they will never again feel completely comfortable on public transport



Around two-thirds have been avoiding unnecessary activities due to the coronavirus



Just over two in five say that they won't use public transport unless social distancing is in place




Half say that they won't use public transport unless passengers are required to wear face coverings


Those who used buses or trains regularly prior to March 2020 are more likely than others to feel as comfortable using trains or buses now as they did before the pandemic


Transport Focus Data Hub

Survey method and sample breakdown – week 58

- c.2000 online interviews per wave. Using Yonder Consulting omnibus.
- Nationally representative of Great British population not all respondents are passengers on public transport.
- Those who have provided a response are excluded from the subsequent wave of research.
- Fieldwork repeated every weekend. Wave 58 fieldwork: 13-15 August
- The analysis of attitudinal questions excludes responses from those who don't have an opinion or who say that the question is not applicable to them.
