

Use of public transport in last seven days - Great Britain






Slightly increased proportions have used trains outside London and buses generally



Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 71 Road use is relatively consistent, though more are using taxis




Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 71 Two in five made journeys on foot, while fewer have cycled


Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 71


Falling proportions of those making train journeys in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so




Less than nine in ten of those making journeys by bus outside London in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so






On your most recent bus journey did you wear a face covering? Base: All making journeys by bus


There has been a large uplift in the proportion of those in England (excluding London) who wore a face covering on their last train or bus journey compared with earlier this year




Less than three in five of those who have not used a train in the last seven days say that they would feel safe doing so




Half of those who have not used a bus in the last seven days say they would feel safe doing so



Seven in ten say that they feel safer using public transport with people wearing face coverings





For a growing proportion Coronavirus is a major concern. Those who have a disability are more likely than others to agree



A third do not feel that enough is being done to ensure coronavirus safety on public transport



Three in ten say that they will never again feel completely comfortable on public transport






Those who used buses or trains regularly prior to March 2020 are more likely than others to feel as comfortable using trains or buses now as they did before the pandemic


Transport Focus Data Hub

Survey method and sample breakdown – week 71

- c.2000 online interviews per wave. Using Yonder Consulting omnibus.
- Nationally representative of Great British population not all respondents are passengers on public transport.
- Those who have provided a response are excluded from the subsequent wave of research.
- Fieldwork repeated every weekend. Wave 71 fieldwork: 10-12
 December
- The analysis of attitudinal questions excludes responses from those who don't have an opinion or who say that the question is not applicable to them.
