




Around one in five have used public transport last week






One in ten or fewer have used buses or trains outside London last week

Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 74 Less than half made journeys on foot, while fewer have cycled






More than four in five of those making journeys by bus outside London in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so





■ Yes - all the time ■ Yes - some of the time (e.g. when it was busy) ■ No ■ Can't remember


On your most recent bus journey did you wear a face covering? Base: All making journeys by bus (345)

Almost nine in ten wore a face covering on their last train or bus journey




More than three in five of those who have not used a train in the last seven days say that they would feel safe doing so

—Those who used trains regularly before March 2020




More than half of those who have not used a bus in the last seven days say they would feel safe doing so




Around seven in ten say that they feel safer using public transport with people wearing face coverings



For around half Coronavirus is a major concern. Those who have a disability are more likely than others to agree






Less than three in ten do not feel that enough is being done to ensure coronavirus safety on public transport






Three in ten say that they will never again feel completely comfortable on public transport


Transport Focus Data Hub

Survey method and sample breakdown – week 74

- c.2000 online interviews per wave. Using Yonder Consulting omnibus.
- Nationally representative of Great British population not all respondents are passengers on public transport.
- Those who have provided a response are excluded from the subsequent wave of research.
- Fieldwork repeated every weekend. Wave 74 fieldwork: 14-16 January 2022
- The analysis of attitudinal questions excludes responses from those who don't have an opinion or who say that the question is not applicable to them.
