


Increasing proportions have used public transport






There has been an increase in bus and train use both inside and outside London




Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 77 Road use is relatively consistent, though taxi use is increasing



Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 77 Half made journeys on foot, while fewer have cycled



Almost three in five of those who are working have travelled to work and have not worked from home over the last seven days




Almost nine in ten of those making train journeys in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so




Almost nine in ten of those making journeys by bus outside London in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so



■Yes - all the time ■Yes - some of the time (e.g. when it was busy) ■No ■Can't remember


On your most recent bus journey did you wear a face covering? Base: All making journeys by bus (379)





There has been a decline in the proportion wearing face coverings on train and bus journeys



Among those using buses in trains in England (excluding London) around three in five wore a face covering on their last train journey, while seven in ten did so when using a bus




Two thirds of those who have not used a train in the last seven days say that they would feel safe to do so

Base: All who used trains regularly before March 2020, but have not done so in the last seven days (350)




Three in five of those who have not used a bus in the last seven days say they would feel safe to do so




Around three quaters say that they feel safer using public transport with people wearing face coverings

For around half Coronavirus is a major concern. Those who have a disability are more likely than others to agree.



Less than three in ten do not feel that enough is being done to ensure coronavirus safety on public transport






Transport Focus Data Hub

Survey method and sample breakdown – week 77

- c.2000 online interviews per wave. Using Yonder Consulting omnibus.
- Nationally representative of Great British population not all respondents are passengers on public transport.
- Those who have provided a response are excluded from the subsequent wave of research.
- Fieldwork repeated every weekend. Wave 76 fieldwork: 4-6 February 2022
- The analysis of attitudinal questions excludes responses from those who don't have an opinion or who say that the question is not applicable to them.
