






Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 80 A quarter have used public transport in the last seven days




Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 80 Train use outside London and bus use generally has

increased compared with last week




Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 80 Road use is relatively consistent




Travel during Covid-19: omnibus wave 80 Half have made journeys on foot, while fewer have cycled




Almost nine in ten of those making train journeys in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so




Almost nine in ten of those making journeys by bus outside London in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so




More than four in five of those making journeys by bus in London in the last seven days say that they felt safe doing so



The majority who used a train or a bus in the last seven days say that they wore a face covering all the time on their journey




There has been a sharp decline in the proportion wearing face coverings on train or bus journeys




Among those using trains in England (excluding London) less than a half wore a face covering on their last train journey, while slightly more than half did so when using a bus

Seven in ten of those who have not used a train in the last seven days say that they would feel safe to do so




More than three in five of those who have not used a bus in the last seven days say they would feel safe to do so


Less than seven in ten say that they feel safer using public transport with people wearing face coverings




For less than half Coronavirus is a major concern. Those who have a disability are more likely than others to agree.




A quarter do not feel that enough is being done to ensure coronavirus safety on public transport

Less than three in five have been avoiding unnecessary activities due to the coronavirus





Survey method and sample breakdown – week 80

- c.2000 online interviews per wave. Using Yonder Consulting omnibus.
- Nationally representative of Great British population not all respondents are passengers on public transport.
- Those who have provided a response are excluded from the subsequent wave of research.
- Fieldwork repeated every weekend. Wave 80 fieldwork: 25-27 February 2022
- The analysis of attitudinal questions excludes responses from those who don't have an opinion or who say that the question is not applicable to them.
